
When should I pray?

Pray at least fifty times this year on a schedule of your own choosing. ("This year" means during the 52 weeks following the date you begin this work.) The following blocks are provided for you to note the times you pray, either with a check or a date.

Solomon and the other sages of Israel instructed young men about good and bad companions, good and bad women, family, money, debt, labor, words, behavior at court, power, justice and many other essential topics.

Five-Point Prayer Plan for Our Men

- 1. Pray for courageous model men (Christ-like men) to rise up in our churches, businesses, academia, the military, and in government. You can't make men without men.
- **2. Pray for men and boys to follow true men,** not satanic counterfeits. Pray for worthy men to mentor as pastors, bosses, coaches, teachers, drill instructors, scout masters, etc.
- **3. Pray for male-only organizations.** The men of any society must organize masculine societies if boys are to be brought into manhood. When any institution fills up with women, by definition it loses its power to bring boys into the company of men.
- **4. Pray for gender-specific teaching** from the Bible, Proverbs, and other manuals to reemerge. (*Five Aspects* for men and young men are good, but they will not be very effective apart from mentoring men who use these tools in conjunction with training.)
- **5. Pray for organizations which train men.** Manhood is not just about relating or thinking; it is something men do—with standards, purpose, and with rigorous accountability.
